How it fits into the curriculum

Science and Entrepreneurship:

Recycle to Create – Introduce students to recycling with something as simple as a crafting or art project. Then, show them how this can turn into a business.

English and Entrepreneurship:

Writing- have children write down their own goals and business proposals.



Communication Skills – teach children how to pitch their ideas and improve on their presentation skills.

Mathematics and Entrepreneurship:

Calculations – mentally calculating the total and giving/getting change.

P.S.H.E and Entrepreneurship:

Decision making – seeing an opportunity, seizing it and strategizing possible solutions.

Teaching, modeling and engaging students in entrepreneurship opportunities helps to prepare them for future opportunities, it is never too early to start molding them.
