GENERAL UPDATES FROM HOME

It will be very useful information if you reach out to management incase you are running late that one time or if your child is to miss school on a particular day. It helps the teacher to support the child in what he or she will have missed but for our staff to also track attendance genuinely other than having no reason to the absence. Not only for that reason though. Please be aware that many colleges/universities require us to mention more about the students' attendance and this in most cases is based on what we have tracked over the years.

ARRIVAL

It is understandable that our roads can have high stagnant traffic especially in the morning. The school has tried to adjust its timings over the years to accommodate families that come through routes that have heavy traffic. However, we have noted that every time we adjust, the same families come in later than usual.
